Many people erroneously think that this is painful for the bereaved. On the contrary, it is part of the healing process to talk about the loved one. Tell the griever that you are praying for them. Perhaps you could invite them to go to church and out for coffee on one of the days between Christmas and New Year's. In the end, it is simply caring with compassion. One friend, one person who is truly understanding, who takes the trouble to listen to us as we consider our youth.
