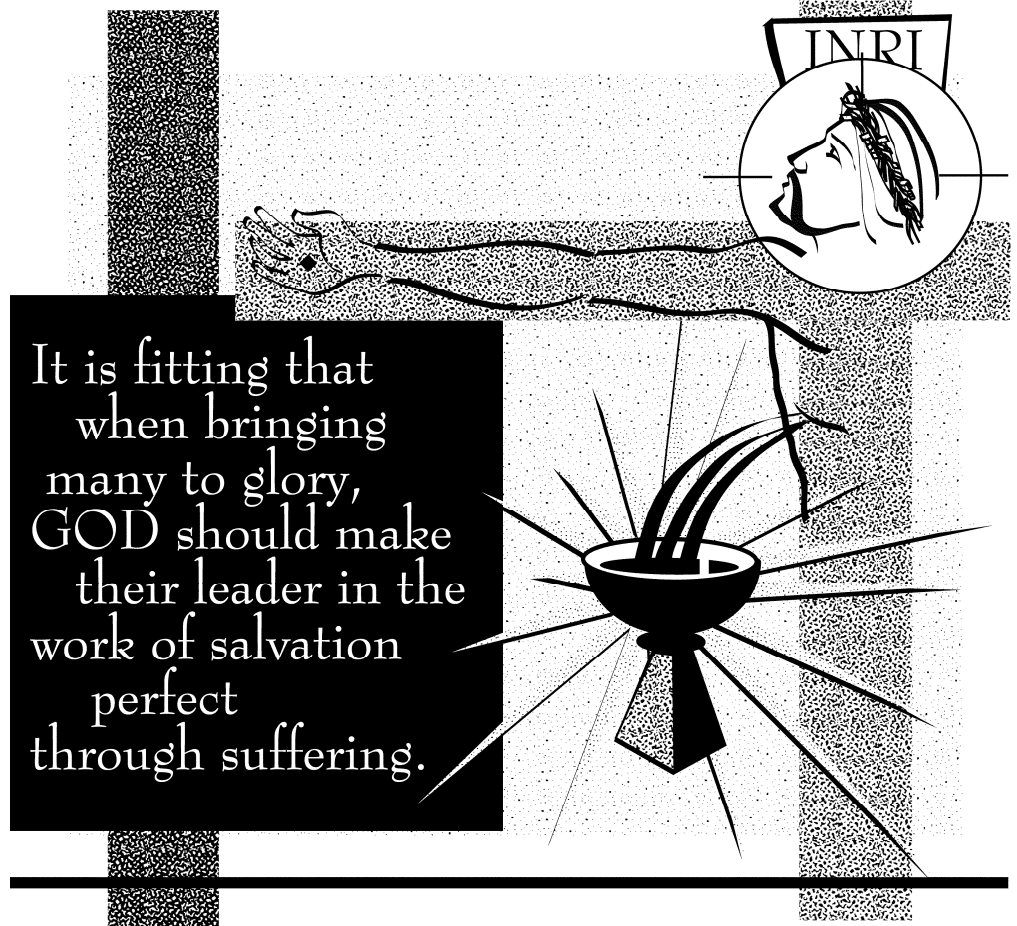

Parish Health Notes—One in seven men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in their lifetime. Know your risk and family history. There are no symptoms of early stage prostate cancer, making it critical to understand your risk. Talk to your doctor about testing after you turn 40. Early detection saves lives. Exercising regularly, maintaining a healthy weight, and eating a heart-healthy diet can help reduce your risk of prostate cancer. Nearly 100 percent of men diagnosed with prostate cancer in its early stages are still alive five years after diagnosis.
