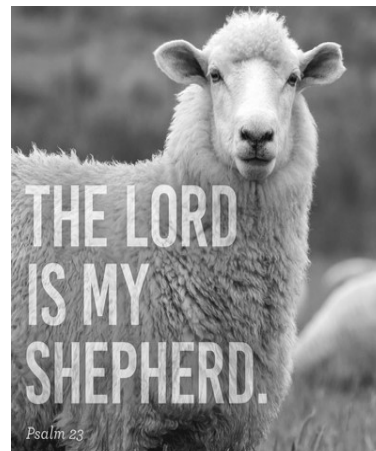

This will bring you to our parish YouTube page and access to our weekend Mass.

Mark your calendar for a unique stations of the cross which will be held on April 1st at 7:00 p.m., presented by the 9th grade class. We will be reading Stations of the Cross with St. Oscar Romero. St. Romero is a recently canonized saint. Stations will be followed by a movie about the life of Romero. Everyone is welcome. This would be a nice event to attend as a family.

Notes for Mass during this unique time— Bishop Joseph Hanefeldt has suspended the obligation for the faithful in the Diocese of Grand Island to attend Sunday Masses indefinitely.

Our Parish in Chadron will be doing the following to help reduce the spread of any illness:

Water fonts will be emptied, we will not hold hands during the Our Father, and communion will only be offered under one species. Hand sanitizer will be available for use.

If you are ill, please stay home, and as always practice good hygiene. Wash your hands, and avoid touching your face.

“Please take some time to pray for those who are suffering from the current outbreak of disease, and for those who have died from this disease in recent weeks. For those who provide care to others – those in health care, in homes caring for those who are infirm or dying, for childcare providers, for all emergency workers, to name a few. LIVE THE LITURGY

Seeing is much more than just a function of our eyes. We can look at something with clear vision but not really see it. Often what we think we see is colored by our presuppositions, prejudices, assumptions, and needs. We judge things by appearance, but God looks into the heart. God’s sight has a much wider range and far greater depth. Receiving things or people just based on appearance can lead us to erroneous and hurtful judgments. We think we are seeing clearly, but we are not. Allowing God to restore our sight so that we can truly see is a worthy goal for our Lenten journey. Look within and look without. What do you see? Allow God to complete the picture for you. Ask Him to give you the insight to look into someone’s heart. Don’t draw hasty conclusions or presume you know the truth. Be open and humble enough so that you can receive the sight that only God can give. ©LPi
