

LAST CALL TO REGISTER FOR A BIBLE STUDY!!


Bible Study—*opportunities to grow together, as the body of Christ, in faith and relationship* will be offered by St. Patrick's the following dates and times:

Parish Health Notes



- The start of the school year has begun.
- It is important for parents driving their children to and from school to slow down and be attentive.
- *More children are accidentally hit by vehicles near schools than any other location.* Here are some school safety tips to follow during school drop-off and pick-up:
 - ♦ Don't double park; it blocks visibility for other children and vehicles.
 - ♦ Carpool children to school to help reduce traffic congestion.
 - ♦ Don't block the crosswalk or force pedestrians to go around you.
 - ♦ When school zone flashers are blinking, stop and yield to pedestrians crossing the crosswalk or intersection.
 - ♦ Always stop for a school patrol officer or crossing guard holding up a stop sign.
 - ♦ Take extra care to look out for children in school zones, on sidewalks and near playgrounds, parks and residential areas.
 - ♦ Don't honk or rev your engine to scare any pedestrian, even if you have the right of way.
 - ♦ Never pass a vehicle stopped for pedestrians or a school bus.
 - ♦ Watch for bikes coming from driveways or behind

Pro-Life—The Right to Life is Fundamental

In the Preamble to the Declaration of Independence, Thomas Jefferson made it very clear that all human beings "are endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable rights". Chief and first among those he enumerated was the Right to Life.

Jefferson and our founding fathers knew that without the right to life, no other rights are possible. How can one have the right to vote or the right to free speech, for example, if one does not firstly have the right to exist?

The rights mentioned in the Declaration are no less valid than those articulated in our Constitution. In fact, they are foundational to all the rights and protections which the Constitution guarantees. This applies especially to the right to life, which is not only paramount but is also clearly protected under the 14th Amendment by due process of law.

We need to impress upon our children the importance of these two documents and how they already guarantee every American, born or unborn, weak or strong, the blessing of Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness.

"The fight for the right to life is not he cause of a special few, but the cause of every man, woman and child who cares not only about his or her own family, but
