

Parish Health Notes—The population 65 and over has increased from 35.9 million in 2003 to 44.7 million in 2013 (a 24.7% increase) and is projected to more than double to 98 million in 2060. About one in every seven, or 14.1%, of the population is an older American. There were 67,347 persons aged 100 or more in 2013 (0.15% of the total 65+ population). Older women outnumber older men at 25.1 million older women to 19.6 million older men. Older men were much more likely to be married than older women—72% of men, 46% of women. In 2014, 35% older women were widows. In 2013, about 536,000 grandparents aged 65 or more had the primary responsibility for their grandchildren who lived with them. The 85+ population is projected to triple from 6 million in 2013 to 14.6 million in 2040. www.acl.gov.
