

Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King

November 22, 2015

Hail, Christ our King!

FROM THE DESK OF FR. TIM: Next weekend is the beginning of Advent. Advent has a twofold character: as a time to prepare for the solemnity of Christmas when the Son of God's first coming to us is remembered; as a season when that remembrance directs the mind and heart to await Christ's second coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, the season of Advent is thus a period for devout and joyful expectation.

During our celebration of Advent, we will also have the Jesse Tree in the church. The Jesse Tree is named from Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot will spring forth from the stump of Jesse, and a branch out of his roots." It is a vehicle to tell the Story of God in the Old Testament, and to connect the Advent Season with the faithfulness of God across 4,000 years of history. The Branch is a biblical sign of newness out of discouragement, which became a way to talk about the expected messiah. It is therefore an appropriate symbol of Jesus the Christ, who is the revelation of the grace and faithfulness of God.

The Jesse Tree is a celebration that the kids will take part in at the beginning of Mass on the 4 Sundays of Advent.

This weekend the Knights of Columbus will be selling Christmas cards in the gathering area of the church. If you are in need of Christmas cards, here's your chance to buy them.

This weekend we will be distributing Christmas bags to be filled for the Newman kids. Each year we have done this and with much success. We give thanks for the presence of Newman students in our parish. This Christmas is a chance for you to tell a Newman student how much you appreciate them and that you pray for them during the Christmas Season. The Bible is the rope—The Bible is a collection of 66 books. The Holy Bible offers enlightenment on the basics of living as God would have us live. It offers instruction, encouragement, inspiration, hope and wisdom—things needed for life's journey.

A brilliant Bible scholar, J.I. Packer, once wrote: "The Bible is the rope God throws us in order to ensure that we stay connected while the rescue is in progress." We need that "rope" and we need it daily.

There is a prayer regarding the Bible written by Thomas Cranmer for the *Angelican Prayer Book (Book of Common Prayer)*. The prayer is, as we might expect, in Old English, yet it is understandable and helpful today. Here it is:

"Blessed Lord who has caused all Holy Scriptures to be written for our learning: Grant that we may in such wise hear them, read, mark, learn and inwardly digest them, that by patience, and comfort of thy Holy Word, we may embrace, and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life, which thou hast given us in our Saviour Jesus Christ.
