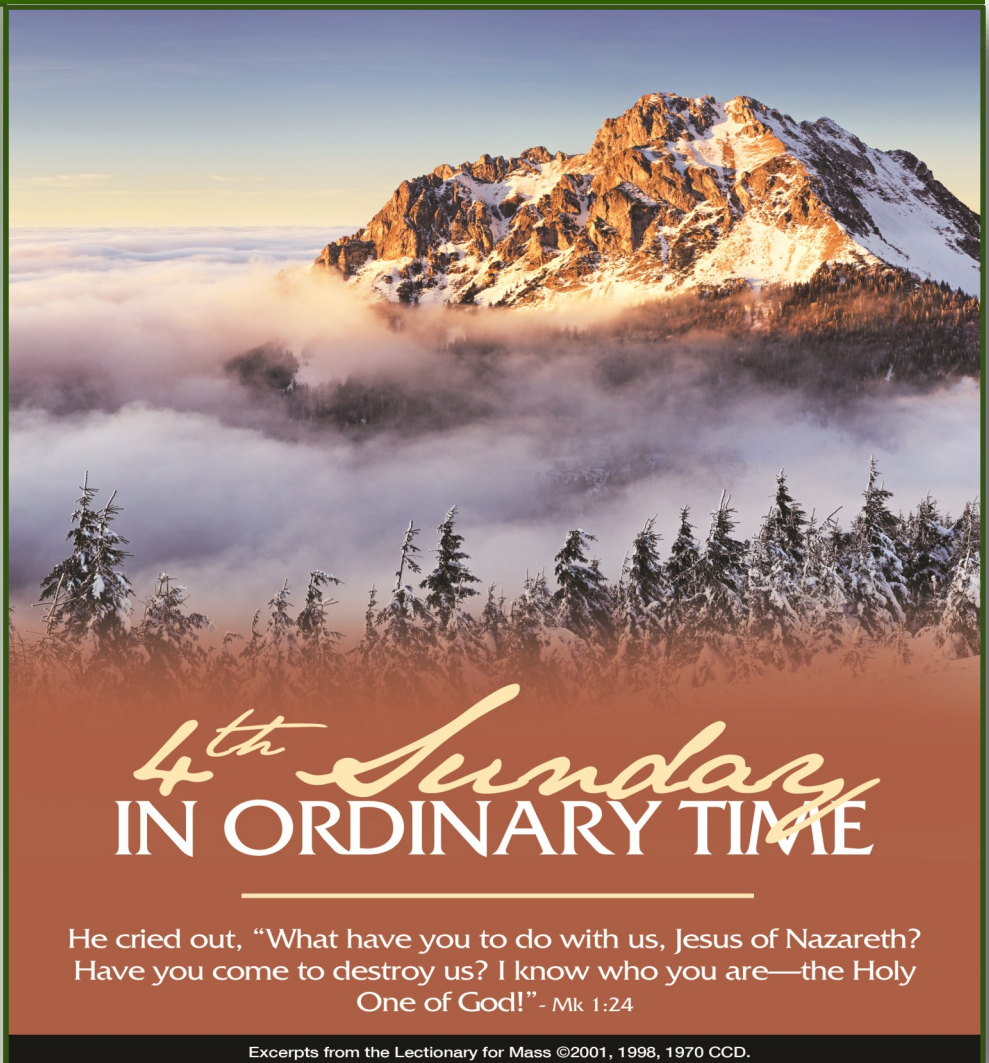

oactive gas that can be released in
rocks and soil. Invisible and odorless,
radon can build up to dangerous and
unhealthy levels inside our homes.

According to the EPA, it is considered the 2nd
leading cause of lung cancer, and The Depart-
ment of Health and Human Services states that,
"Nebraska has a very high prevalence of radon in
homes." Winter is the ideal time to test for ra-
don. Kits can be ordered online or can be ob-
tained for free by contacting the Panhandle Pub-
lic Health District. If levels are elevated, sealing
floor cracks and adding ventilation are ways they
can be reduced.
