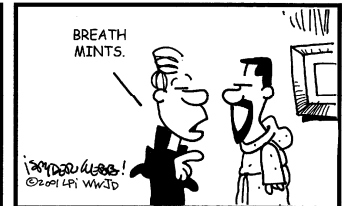

Parish Health Notes *Grief Support*

Losing someone you love and care deeply about is very painful. You may experience all kinds of difficult emotions and it may feel like the pain and sadness you're experiencing will never let up. These are normal reactions to a significant loss. While there is no right or wrong way to grieve, there are healthy ways to cope with the pain that, in time, can renew you. Grieving is a personal and highly individual experience. How you grieve depends on many factors, including your personality, your life experience, your faith, and the nature of the loss. The grieving process takes time. Healing happens gradually; it can't be forced or hurried—and there is no "normal" timetable for grieving. The single most important factor in healing from loss is having the support of other people. Grief can feel very lonely, even when you have loved ones around. Sharing your sorrow with others who have experienced similar losses can provide a strong connection and help in your healing. www.helpguide.org

Pro Life Abortion And The Economy (Part I)

Children are our greatest natural resource.

Yet, throughout the western world, birthrates have plummeted. In Europe, the major countries such as Germany, Italy, France, Greece and the UK all have total fertility rates (TFR or children per female) well below 1.5.

Japan's TFR is at rock bottom at 1.1. Because of the "one-child" policy, China's TFR is also around 1.5 and their future problems will undoubtedly be compounded by the gender imbalance (caused by selective abortions).

Countries have little future when birthrates fall so low. Economically, the problems are obvious. Governments in Europe and North America have built elaborate and generous entitlement states since World War II.

But an aging population and the inverted demographic pyramid places enormous burdens on the youth, causing significant and ultimately catastrophic strains on the public purse. The US alone has \$100 trillion worth of unfunded public liabilities.
