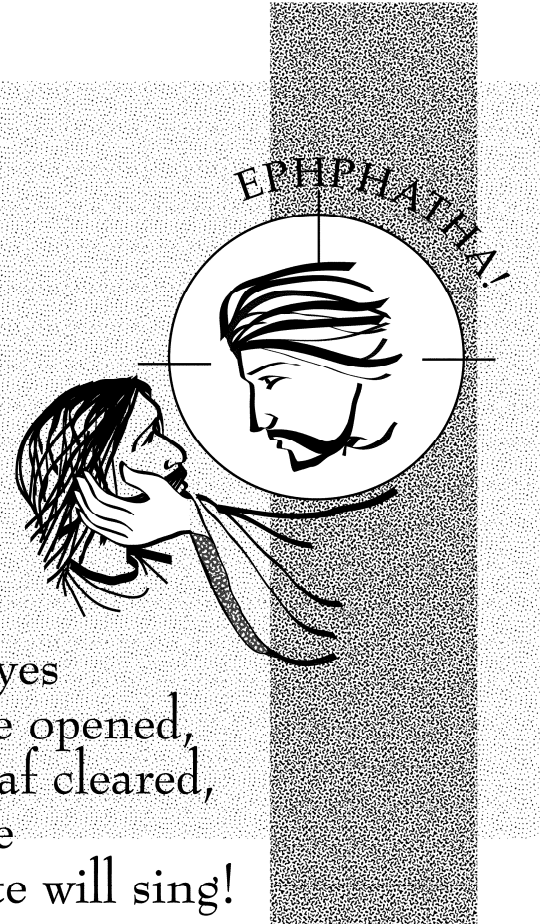

## Parish Health Notes—Breastfed babies...

\*Get sick less and have a lower risk of allergies. \*Have a lower risk of obesity and Types 1 and 2 diabetes. \*Have a lower incidence of SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome). \*Have a reduced risk for ear infections and gastroenteritis. \*Are on a path to optimal brain development. \*Get nutrients that help strengthen and develop their immature immune system in a way no other substance can. \*Respond better to immunization. \*Have optimal oral development because of their jaw movements and nutrients in breast milk decrease the risk of tooth decay. \*Have extra protection against respiratory infections including those caused by rotaviruses. \*Are less likely to be hospitalized with pneumonia or bronchiolitis, and have a decreased risk of lower respiratory tract infections.

*And for the Moms ...* decreased rates of breast and ovarian cancer. Breastfeeding also reduces the risk of developing Type 2 diabetes, rheumatoid arthritis and cardiovascular disease, including high blood pressure and high cholesterol. [www.lansinoh.com](http://www.lansinoh.com)
