Newman News



Theology Institute

Fall Theology Institute offered in Yankton, SD, Saturday, September 17.

The Benedictine Sisters of Sacred Heart Monastery, Yankton, will host their Fall Theology Institute on “The Gospel According to Luke—Bursting with Mercy” from 9 am to noon in the monastery chapter room. The speaker, Fr. Dennis Hamm, S.J., will focus on Luke’s special attention to the theme of God’s mercy.

Fr. Hamm, Professor Emeritus of New Testament at Creighton University in Omaha, NE states, “I plan to share what I have learned about Luke’s way of treating the theme of God’s mercy and compassion through his two-volume work—The Third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles. [My] approach will...demonstrate what we learn when we read his way of telling the stories of Jesus and the early church against the background of Mark’s version and the Greek version of the Hebrew scriptures.” Fr. Hamm adds that he is happy to share insights gained from writing a new commentary on Luke for a forthcoming series from Paulist Press.

Parish Health Notes

Every year, tens of thousands of Americans get sick from diseases that could be prevented. Immunization is our best protection against these diseases. Vaccines have greatly reduced diseases that once regularly harmed or killed many infants, children and adults. Here are six reasons to consider when it comes to immunizations:

1. Vaccines help protect against serious diseases across the human life-span.
2. Outbreaks of vaccine-preventable diseases can and do still happen across many communities in the U.S.
3. The CDC and FCA take many steps to make sure vaccines are safe.
4. Immunization is a powerful defense that is safe, scientifically proven, and effective in protecting children , and adults from communicable disease.
5. Recommended vaccinations while pregnant provide newborn babies with added protection against disease.
6. Even if you received all your vaccines as a child, the protection from some vaccines can wear off over time. Adults with chronic conditions like asthma, COPD, heart disease and diabetes are more likely to have complications from certain diseases.
