Did you know that by 2029, more than 20% of Americans will be at retirement age? Three ways to embrace life in retirement include:



**Volunteerism.** Volunteers meet a range of community needs, from mentoring at-risk youth to providing job training to first-time employees. Volunteer service bolsters feelings of gratitude and provides a sense of meaning and purpose in later life. Furthermore, older Americans who volunteer over time live longer and report fewer disabilities.

**Creative Expression.** Creative activities such as writing, painting, dancing, acting or playing a musical instrument are essential to self-reflection and expression across the life-span. In addition, studies have linked the arts to improved memory among older adults.

**Life-long Learning.** It is never too late to learn how to speak a new language, sharpen computer skills, or travel and discover other cultures.

Learning never grows old and fosters new social connections, increases life satisfaction, and improves health for older adults.

These past few days I have gathered in Rapid City with the other Priests of our Diocese for a retreat. It is always good to have a change in routine where one can be quiet and pray.

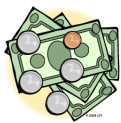
